absorbent	materials that soak up water easily
dull	not bright
hard	not easily broken
material	what an object is made from
rough	bumpy or uneven, not smooth
shiny	bright
smooth	no roughness or bumps
soft	not rough or hard
stiff	does not bend or stretch easily
stretchy	can be pulled to make it longer without breaking
waterproof	does not let water pass through it

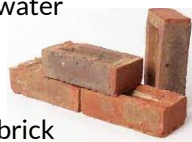
