

What is Phonics?

Phonics is the process of teaching children to read.




• In phonics, children are taught how to write and say the 44 **phonemes** (sounds) in the English language. Once they know these sounds they should be able to read most words.





Phoneme

This is **one** sound that can be written using one or more letters Example m, ow or igh.

• In RWI, children learn how to say the 44 sounds in the English language.








Grapheme

This refers to the written letters.

In Read Write Inc, children will learn what the letters look like.

Some sounds are made up of 1 letter while other sounds are made up of 2 or more











Grapheme


To make things difficult, there is more than one way to write the same sound.

Example:

f ff ph All make the same sound.

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How is phonics taught?


• At Brentfield Primary School we use **Read Write Inc Phonics** to teach the children phonics.




When they learn, children are taught the sounds in Sets (Set 1, 2 and 3)

Set 1

Children start by learning the set 1 sounds in Early Years. In this set, they learn the simple sounds and how to write these letters using a rhyme.







Set 1

Once children have learnt the first few sounds, the start to put the sounds together to read green words.

We call this blending.

Some words cannot be read using phonics. These are red words. Children must learn to read these by sight.






Set 2

At the end of Reception, children move to Set 2. In this set, children are taught how to say the long vowel sounds.

To help them learn these, children are taught a rhyme.




Speed Sounds Set 2






























Set 3


In set 3, children are taught the alternative way to write the same sounds.

To help them tell the difference between set 2 and set 3, children are taught a rhyme.

At this point, children will begin to bring home RWI phonics books.

It is important that you spend time at home reading these books with your children.

The Phonics Screening Check

This is a test that is done at the end of **year 1** to see if children have learnt the sounds and can read.


The teacher will sit with 1 child and do the test (2 – 5 minutes long).

The test has 40 words:

20 real words and 20 alien words

For children to pass, they must correctly read **32** or more words.


If they fail, they will have to do the test again at the end of Year 2.

Set 1

 Magnetic Letters – put the letters together to make and read simple words like

c-a-t or f-r-o-g






Set 1

Visit your local library and find out what early reader books they have available. Spend some time in the library choosing and reading the books.





Practice writing letters (graphemes) and digraphs in different media. You could try sand, salt, sugar, glacé icing, cornflour gloop or shaving foam. Try this Rainbow Tray Busy Bag Resource Pack for a colourful sensory writing tray.

How can you help at home?

Set 2 and 3

Read the phonics books sent home together.

Practise reading the green words.

Make sure your child can read the red words by sight.

Ask them questions about the book.

Read the book at least 3 times.




How to use the Read Write Inc. Books.

For each book, eight reading activities should be completed.





1. Practise reading the speed sounds with your child.






2. Read the green and red words for the story






Read the introduction while your child listens so they know what will be happening in the story.








 Discuss the vocabulary that will be in the book, make sure they know what those words mean.






Read the story





- 6. Re-read the story and discuss the 'questions to talk about'
- 7. Re-read the story with fluency and expression.

8. Practise reading the speed words (at the back of the book).





The book should be read at least 3 times with the children.

The first time they read it, they should focus only on using their phonics to help them read the words.

The second time the children read the book they should try to focus on what is happening in the story and answer questions.

The third time they read the book, the children should read with more fluency pausing where there is punctuation. They should also practise using their voice when a character is speaking.



Letter Lifter

First click the lever to start the belt. An object will appear and you will hear the word. Type the first letter of the word. If you get it right you will be able to click on the lift button and the object will be taken away. (ICT Games)



Phoneme Pop

Choose the group of phonemes (sounds) you want the child to practise. The sound is spoken clearly and the child has to pop the bubble containing the matching sound. Simple, but strangely satisfying, like popping bubble wrap. (ICT Games)



ord Wheel


This game uses three-letter words. Decide which word the picture represents, then stop each wheel when the correct letters are showing. Quite tricky! (Crickweb)



<u>Reading machine</u>

practise reading cvc (consonant, vowel, consonant) words with the reading machine. Choose the correct word from the three displayed to match the object on the machine. Click next to go to the next word. (ICT Games)
