At A Fire Drill

A picture perfect student will

1. walk and not run.
2. follow your teacher outside.
3. wait with your class and do not talk.
4. listen for the all clear.
5. listen for your teacher's signal when it is time to go inside.
6. line up and follow the teacher.

Schools often have fire drills to help pupils know what to do in an emergency.

Always alert someone in the event of a fire.

DIAL 999
and ask for the fire service!

If you find a fire....

Raise the alarm!

Signs linked to fire safety



Fire Safety

Never play with matches or lighters.

They can be very dangerous and you could be badly burned.



Make sure that there are smoke alarms in your home.

Test them every week and change their batteries regularly.



Talk to your family about a fire escape plan.

Plan the quickest and safest way out of your home if there is a fire.



If you see smoke or a fire, tell a grown-up straight away.

If you are inside a building, get out as quickly as you can.



If your clothes catch on fire:

- 1) Stop what you are doing.
- 2) Drop to the ground.
- 3) Roll on the floor to put out the fire.



In the event of an emergency, call 999 and ask for the fire service.

Only call 999 if there is a real emergency.
