Arctic Ocean: the ocean around the North Pole.

Atlantic Ocean: the second-largest ocean in the world and covers around 20% of the Earth's surface.

Indian Ocean: the third largest of Earth's oceans surrounding Asia.

Pacific Ocean: is the largest named ocean and it covers one-third of the surface of the entire world.

Ocean- a very large area of sea.

Sea-a large area of salty water that is partly or completely surrounded by land.

Southern Ocean: is the most southerly of the planet's five oceans.
