MATHEMATICS

- The children will consolidate their understanding of multiplication and division.
- They will be learning about properties of 2D and 3D shapes.
- · They will also be learning how to find fractions of a shape, quantity and number.



COMPUTING

Presenting Ideas:

- The children will examine a traditional tale presented as a mind map, as a quiz, as an e-book and as a fact file.
- The children will make a quiz about a story using 2Quiz.
- The children will make a publisher fact file on a non-fiction topic.



MUSIC

- Working with tutors from Brent Music Service, children will play tuned and untuned instruments.
- The children will learn to play melodies on the recorder and listen and copy patterns.



The children will learn about the importance of water and find out how different communities express beliefs and values through water.

ENGLISH



- Children will read the True Story of the Three Little Pigs and use the text to write a set of instructions and a character description.
- The children will also be reading The Last Wolf and will be using it to write a setting description and a narrative.



PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

- Children will learn how to effectively send and receive when working with a partner and as part of a team.
- · They will use these skills when playing team games.



TOPIC

- History: The children will be learning about the wonders of the world. They will name and place them on a timeline and use a wide range of historical vocabulary.
- Design Technology: The children will design and make a model of a chosen wonder of the world. They will investigate cutting, joining and strengthening techniques.



SCIENCE

Plants

· The children will observe and describe how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants.



They will find out and record how plants need water, light and a suitable temperature to grow and stay healthy.

PSHE and RSE

- The children will learn how to stay safe around fire.
