Online safety

S **Stay Safe**
Don't give out your personal information to people / places you don't know.

M **Don't Meet Up**
Meeting someone you have only been in touch with online can be dangerous. Always check with an adult you trust.

A **Accepting Files**
Accepting emails, files, pictures or texts from people you don't know can cause problems.

R **Reliable?**
Check information before you believe it. Is the person or website telling the truth?

T **Tell Someone**
Tell an adult if someone or something makes you feel worried or uncomfortable.

Low levels of rainfall and scorching hot summers can cause droughts.

FLOAT – if you fall in, stay calm and float to live.
