Key Vocabulary

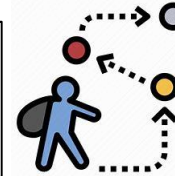
Migration	Relocation from one region to another.
Migrant	A person who moves from one place to another.
Refugee	A person who has been forced to leave their country to escape war or natural disaster.
Safe haven	A place of safety or refuge.
Route	A way or course taken from a starting point to a destination.
Risk	A situation involving exposure to danger.
Digital footprint	The information about a person that exists on the internet as a result of their online activity.

Migration

People migrate for many different reasons. Some people do so because they want to, whereas others have to migrate due to issues beyond their control. It can be temporary or permanent.



Some people may migrate to find a better quality of life for themselves or their families. They may have a new job in another place not where they normally live.



War in countries causes people to flee to a safe haven.



Natural disasters such as earthquakes and tsunamis or extreme weather causing droughts or flooding can cause people to leave their home town or country.

Cycling is an environmentally-friendly and healthy way to travel, but it can have its risks.

Don't Meet Up

Meeting someone you have only been in touch with online can be dangerous. Always check with an adult you trust.

A

Accepting Files

Accepting emails, files, pictures or texts from people you don't know can cause problems.

R

Reliable?

Check information before you believe it. Is the person or website telling the truth?

T

Tell Someone

Tell an adult if someone or something makes you feel worried or uncomfortable.
