
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Key Vocabulary

Homelessness is devastating, dangerous and isolating. It can be caused by many factors and can have many effects on people's lives.




Soup kitchens and foodbanks offer hot meals to people who are homeless.

Places of worship like churches, mosques and temples also provide hot meals.



Shelters are a warm place for people to stay so they do not have to sleep outside.



Not all people who are homeless are rough sleepers. They may sleep in cars, on relatives' sofas or in temporary accommodation like hotels/B and B and hostels. These are not permanent options. This is known as 'hidden homelessness'.








Sometimes people can manipulate others into doing a behaviour that can be risky.



To pressure someone into doing something they do not want to do, people may use certain tactics.





Risky activities can include: smoking, drinking alcohol, stealing, using other drugs, violence and other illegal behaviours.















Too good to be true offers - when someone says they will give or do something that doesn't seem possible.
