How Parents Can Help

COMMUNICATION & LANGUAGE

- Children will use a wider range of vocabulary to speak in longer sentences.
- They will develop their understanding of 'why' questions, like: "Why do you think the caterpillar got so fat?

PERSONAL, SOCIAL & EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT



 Children will develop appropriate ways of being assertive and using talk with others to solve conflicts.

PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

 Through a variety of activities, children will start taking part in some group activities which they make up for themselves, or in teams.



- They will collaborate with others to manage large items, such as moving a long plank safely, carrying large hollow blocks.
- They will continue to develop a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens and pencils.

LITERACY

- Children will use their knowledge of sounds in words to count or clap syllables in a word.
- They will engage in extended conversations about stories, learning new words.
- The children will continue to practice writing their name.



MATHEMATICS

The children will use their knowledge of 2D shapes (square, circle, rectangle, triangle) to talk about and explore 3D shapes (cylinder, cone, cube, sphere, cuboid) using informal and mathematical words like: 'sides', 'corners'; 'straight', 'flat', 'round'.

AUDITORY TRAINING

- Children will explore speech sounds and talk about the different sounds that we can make without voices.
- To distinguish between the differences in vocal sounds, including oral blending and segmenting.
