MATHEMATICS

- The children will be introduced to coins and notes.
- · Children will learn how to tell the time to the hour and half past. They will explore and solve simple time problems (quicker, slower, earlier, later).
- They will explore position and direction.



PHYSICAL EDUCATION

- The children will learn about Multi Sports.
- They will master movements including running, jumping, throwing and catching, as well as develop their balance.



They will participate in team games in preparation for Sport's Day.

TOPIC

- In Art the children will learn about the artist Sonia Delaunay. They will use a range of fabric to design and make products.

SCIENCE

- The children will revisit and consolidate their knowledge of animals.
- They will continue to explore the seasonal changes.



PSHE

COMPUTING



Maze Explorer

The children will use learn how to create and debug a set of instructions (algorithm).

Spreadsheets

 They will explore what a spreadsheet program looks like and use tools to input data into cells.



MUSIC

- The children will consolidate the learning that has taken place across the year by revisiting songs and musical activities.
- They will listen to and appraise classical music and use their voices to sing songs and speak chants and rhymes.
