How Parents Can Help

- Please read to your child every day and comment in their reading record. Example: He/she enjoyed the book. He/she could talk about the pictures or characters
- Practise recognising and writing their names



COMMUNICATION & LANGUAGE

- The children will be encouraged to express their own feelings using simple sentences.
- They will begin to listen carefully and understand why listening is important.
- They will also engage in story times.



PERSONAL, SOCIAL & EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

- The children will explore the learning environment with support.
- With support, they will begin to join in play with peers and adults.
- They will also begin to understand their own feelings socially and emotionally.



PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

- The children will use large-muscle movements to paint and mark-make.
- They will develop their fine motor skills so that they can use a range of tools competently, safely and confidently.

- They will be encouraged to give meaning to the marks they make.

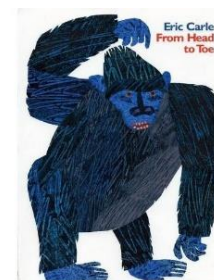


MATHEMATICS

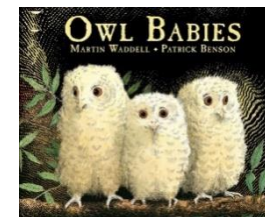
- The children will learn to recite numbers.
